#### WELCOME FROM OUR PRESIDENT MICHAEL LUNNEY

Michael Lunney is the British/Irish Artistic Director/Producer of Middle Ground Theatre Co Ltd and has been since its inauguration in 1988. He also produced/directed charitable performances of 'Meeting Joe Strummer' at The Arts Theatre, West End in 2007.

He has worked over the last four decades with hundreds of gifted actors from the UK/USA/Ireland and beyond including Golden Globe and Bafta Best Actress Nominee Kelly McGillis, TIFF Life Time Achievement Winner and RSC/National Theatre Leading Man Richard Johnson, Olivier Award Winner and Bafta Best Actor Nominee Jack Shepherd (3 plays), Bafta Best Actor Nominee Tony Britton (3 plays), Bafta Best Actress Nominee Judy Cornwell, Multi Golden Globe Best Actress Nominee Stephanie Powers, National Society Of Film Critics Best Actor Nominee Barry Foster along with Dirk Benedict, Philip Madoc, Louise Jameson, George Sewell, Lewis Collins, Diane Fletcher, Gareth Thomas, Sarah Hadland, Dermot Walsh (3 plays), Colin Baker, Terrence Hardiman, Glyn Owen, Patrick Robinson and Hildegard Neil to name but a few.

#### **PAUL FARRER - PATRON**

Paul Farrer is one of the UK's highest profile media composers. He has composed the music for numerous films, video games and TV programmes including Dancing on Ice, Gladiators, Ant and Dec's Push the Button, the Krypton Factor, the Chase, Jedward's Big Adventure, Fort Boyard, the Jerry Springer Show and the BBC's most successful international format of all - The Weakest Link. He is the recipient of a BMI Composer Award. He is a member of both the Media Executive of the British Academy of Songwriters, Composers and Authors and a member of the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA).

#### **WCAF Special Awards**

The following trophies and honours will be awarded to the most outstanding performances in the Festival, with the recommendation of the adjudicators. Winners should be available to perform at the Festival Concert on Saturday 23rd March 2024, where the trophies will be presented.

#### THE MICHAEL LUNNEY PRIZE

This will be awarded to a competitor who has given an exceptional performance in acting. The winner will become involved in the Middle Ground Theatre for a week to learn and observe the working of a prestigious company.

#### ROTARY YOUNG PERFORMER OF THE YEAR

This trophy, kindly donated by Worcester Severn Rotary, will be awarded to a competitor of 12 years or under, who has given an outstanding performance in drama.

#### INNER WHEEL YOUNG PERFORMER OF THE YEAR TROPHY

This trophy, kindly donated by Worcester Severn Rotary, will be awarded to a competitor of 12 years or under, who has given an outstanding performance in music.

#### SEVERN ARTS TROPHY

This trophy, kindly donated by Severn Arts, will be awarded to an inspirational and outstanding instrumental player recommended by the adjudicator. Piano or voice are not eligible.

In addition, there are several classes across the festival where specific trophies and prizes are awarded. Winners will be expected to perform at the Festival Concert on Saturday 23rd March 2024. These include:

002 MARIAN BAKER MEMORIAL PRIZE AND CUP: This prize was donated by the friends and family of the late Marian Baker, a teacher from Kidderminster. Two contrasting pieces of a minimum of Grade 6 standard may be presented on any instrument of voice by any performer aged 12 years or under on 1st September 2023. The prize will be £45 providing Distinction or Honours is achieved.

003 SPROULE PRIZE & TROPHY FOR SPEECH, DRAMA AND MUSIC UP TO 15 YEARS: Any performer aged 15 years or under may perform a poem or an acted scene AND a song or a piece of music on any instrument of the candidate's choice. The Sproule Trophy and £50 will be awarded, providing distinction or honours is achieved.

004 WILLIAM LEWIS RECITAL PRIZE AND SALVER: This prize was donated by the parents and friends of the late William Lewis of Stourport. An interesting, varied programme of two or more contrasting pieces of a minimum of Grade 6 standard for any instrument or voice should be presented, choice of which will be taken into account in adjudication. The William Lewis Salver & £100 will be awarded, providing distinction or honours is achieved.

304 OPEN CLASS FOR PIANO SOLO: The winner of this class will receive the Vale Trophy (kindly donated by Vale Pianos) at the Festival Concert, provided they receive an honours or distinction certificate.

608 OPEN CLASS FOR LIEDER: The winner of this class will receive the Susan Ellis Lieder Prize at the Festival Concert. The prize will be £50, providing the winner gains a Distinction or Honours certificate.

618/619/620/621 WCAF JUNIOR AND SENIOR CHOIRS OF THE YEAR: This year we are pleased to announce the first WCAF Junior and Senior Choir of the Year trophies and prizes, donated by Jan Venables, who is a long-standing and much valued committee member, with connections to the festival stretching back to her own childhood. The titles, trophies and prize of £50 will be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to one choir achieving distinction or honours in either the 8 and under or 10 and under sections and one choir achieving distinction or honours in the 12 and under or 15 and under sections.

930 FESTIVAL PRIZE FOR SOLO ACTING - 20 YEARS AND UNDER: Programme of acting of three contrasting characters of the performer's own choice. A prize of £50 will be awarded providing the winner gains a Distinction or Honours certificate.

1006 BERTULIS SOLO VERSE SPEAKING CHALLENGE TROPHY: The winners of classes 1000, 1001 and 1002 (Set Verse Speaking classes for all ages 12 years and under on 1st September 2023) will be invited to perform again to compete for the Bertulis Solo Verse Speaking Challenge Trophy. This additional class will take place on Saturday 23rd March 2024, ahead of the Festival Concert.

1215/6 THE MARY MANNION COMPOSITION TROPHY: This trophy and a voucher to the value of £15 may be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to the winner of class 1215 or 1216 (Instrumental or Song Composition for all ages 16 years and under on 1st September 2023).

#### **General Rules and Regulations**

#### **GENERAL**

- 1. Entries must be submitted electronically via the PlayandPerform platform by 23:45 on 31st January 2024. Verbal or paper entries will not be accepted.
- 2. No entry can be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee. Fees can be paid via credit or debit card or by BACS transfer at the point of making the entry via PlayandPerform.
- 3. Where relevant, adjudicators copies, manuscripts of original work, videos and backing tracks and must be submitted electronically by 23:45 on 19th February 2024. Late submissions will not be accepted and entry fees will be forfeited if submissions are not received by the deadline.
- 4. Entries may be withdrawn at any point, but fees are non-refundable. Competitors withdrawing from classes are asked to let us know as early as possible: admin@wcaf.org.uk
- 5. The Committee reserves the right to:
- i. change any class to a virtual class, meaning that video submissions will be required by the advertised deadline
  - ii. cancel any class and return the fee
  - iii. divide and/or combine some classes
  - iv. change the order of individual performers in a class and if necessary, the class itself
  - v. make any changes necessary to the festival to accommodate current government guidance on infection control
- 6. The Competitor's age on 1st September 2023 shall be regarded as his/her age for the purposes of the competitions. (This corresponds with the academic year 1st September 31st August.) Therefore, age groups usually equate to the following school year groups:
- 8 years and under School year 4 and below
- 10 years and under School year 6 and below
- 12 years and under School year 8 and below
- 14 years and under School year 10 and below
- 15 years and under School year 11 and below
- 16 years and under School year 12 and below

Open categories can be entered by anyone of any age, but consideration should be given by younger entrants to the expected high standards in this category.

- 7. Competitors may enter only ONE age or standard class plus the OPEN CLASS in each SECTION. Performances on two DIFFERENT instruments may be entered in the same class/section. Individuals may take part in more than one group or ensemble.
- 8. A different piece must be played or performed for each entry.
- 9. It is the performer's responsibility to ensure that they have the correct equipment and music to enable them to perform. Due to difficulties experienced in other recent festivals, our festival advises against the use of digital devices as a digital score.
- 10. Competitors who overrun time limits or perform in the incorrect genre will receive adjudicator's comments only and will not be placed. The adjudicator's decision is final and in no circumstances will any subsequent discussion or correspondence be entered into.
- 11. No eating or drinking is allowed in the competition rooms, but plastic water bottles are permitted.

- 12. Individuals should bring their own music stands with them. Bands and orchestras requiring music stands please contact admin@wcaf.org.uk AT LEAST one week before the festival.
- 13. Recording and photography of Classes is NOT allowed during performances and adjudications. We may have an official photographer who will take photographs during festival days, which may subsequently be used by the Press or on the Festival website. Where parents, guardians or carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that a committee member is aware so that their child/pupil/vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos.
- 14. One of the following categories will be awarded to each performance: Commended, Highly Commended, Merit, Distinction, Honours. In all cases the Adjudicator's decision will be final. The Adjudicator will announce the winner of each class. In classes of 5 or more, a 2nd place will also be awarded. In classes of 10 or more, a 3rd place will also be awarded.
- 15. Copies of the Adjudicator's remarks should be collected from the steward at the close of each Class. Certificates should be collected from the certificate area in the foyer. There may be a slight delay, as certificates are prepared as quickly as possible following the end of the class.
- 16. Trophy winners are required to sign a form on receipt of their trophy.
- 17. The timetable will be available in advance on the WCAF website: www.wcaf.org.uk It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are in the correct place at the right time. A map and signage will be available at the venue.

#### MUSIC CLASSES

- 18. In classes where the time limit is 5 minutes or less, ONE PIECE is to be performed. Where the time limit is 6 minutes or more, ONE or TWO pieces may be performed unless otherwise stated. Timings should include breaks between pieces. The competitor should give an introduction (no longer than 30 seconds) including the title of the piece to be performed.
- 19. A copy of own choice pieces must be provided for the Adjudicator in the same key as the performance. For Rock and Pop and Jazz classes, a formal score might not always be appropriate, but a chord tab or crib sheet MUST be provided instead, clearly indicating the title and composer. Unauthorised copying of music is an infringement of copyright. If the music is out of print, permission to copy MUST be obtained in writing from the publishers and a copy of their letter or email attached to the music. The Music Publishers' Association has issued a code of practice making the concession that own choice pieces may be copied from volumes only and for the use of the Adjudicator only. The copying of music for the accompanist is forbidden. Photocopies for the Adjudicator must be totally legible. With the exception of the above concession, no other photocopying of music is permitted. If music is downloaded from the internet, the performer should also print off and submit the permission statement that accompanies the music. The adjudicators' photocopies will not be returned.
- 20. There is no official festival accompanist. Where necessary, competitors should bring their own accompanist (and page turner where necessary). Pre-recorded backing tracks are only acceptable where stated in the syllabus. Where pre-recorded backing tracks are used, they must be uploaded by 19th February 2024. The backing track should not include the same vocal line or instrument that is being performed. Performers are responsible for ensuring that the uploaded version is correct.
- 21. Where specifically stated in the syllabus, high quality backing tracks may be used, providing that they are balanced and do not detract from the overall performance. Where backing tracks are used,

they must be uploaded by 19th February 2024. The backing track should not include the same vocal line or instrument that is being performed. Performers are responsible for ensuring that the uploaded version is correct. No solo instrument or voice is permitted as part of any backing track and the part being played or sung by the entrant should not be duplicated as part of the backing track.

#### MUSICAL THEATRE, POETRY, PROSE AND DRAMA CLASSES

- 22. The Festival has an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or SOLO dramatic item performed, to a time limit of 15 minutes. Authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this Festival. Duologues and group dramatic activity are NOT covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.
- 23. The title and author of all own choice pieces must be handed to the adjudicator's steward before the class starts. A copy of own choice pieces must be provided for the Adjudicator at the beginning of the Class.
- 24. For poetry, prose and drama classes, competitors are reminded that due to Performing Rights, no costume or scenery may be used but movement and basic props are allowed. The following props are acceptable practice skirts, practice trousers, scarves, shawls, headwear, gloves, fans and other hand-held small items. Competitors in these classes are allowed to provide their own prompts. Competitors should NOT wear stage makeup.
- 24. For musical theatre classes, competitors are reminded that due to Performing Rights, only a suggestion of costume or makeup may be used. Scenery and and basic props are permitted if they can be carried on and off the stage by the performer themselves.
- 25. Unacceptable Language Thresholds. Some works performed often explore adult themes, and contain strong language. However care should be taken when choosing or devising contemporary pieces. We ask that you present your work in a manner that respects the 'family' orientated nature of the festival and avoids the unnecessary exposure of younger children to inappropriate themes and language. Therefore, all entrants to the speech, drama and musical theatre sections are now asked to confirm whether their performance contains adult language or content upon entry. If you indicate you have potentially contentious language or themes, a representative from WCAF will be in contact to discuss and a copy of the piece as you intend to perform it must be sent prior to the festival. Four letter words (e.g. f\*\*\*) must be replaced by milder expletives, and such expletives should be used only sparingly. The festival aims to celebrate the best and highest forms of literature and language, and therefore reserves the right to refuse entries that are made up of continuously bad language and/or gratuitous expletives.
- 26. The person making the entries should ensure that each entrant is aware of all the rules and has read the Safeguarding Policy and the Privacy documents.
- 27. Any electrical equipment brought for use at WCAF must have a valid PAT test.

#### **ADMISSION**

28. The Festival is run by volunteers but, in order to hire the venue and pay professional adjudicators, a charge for admission has to be made. Members of the public will be admitted to the festival at a charge of:

Adults £5.00

Children (under 18) Free

Tickets are valid for the whole day. There are no half-day tickets. SCHOOLS ARE REQUESTED TO

INFORM ANY PARENTS LIKELY TO ATTEND THAT THERE WILL BE A CHARGE FOR ADMISSION. Competitors, teachers, conductors and accompanists are admitted free of charge.

- 29. Programmes covering all days of the Festival will be available priced £3.
- 30. Spectator tickets and programmes will be available in advance via the WCAF website and on the door on the days of the festival. Please bring your proof of purchase to reception on the day of the festival to receive your entry stickers.
- 31. Car parking and disabled access is limited at some venues. Please contact admin@wcaf.org.uk well in advance so that arrangements can be made for disabled access if necessary.

#### SPECIAL CLASSES Syllabus

The Worcester Competitive Arts Festival has special classes across the festival to celebrate and reward high achievement and to encourage the youngest performers.

#### **Party Pieces**

The Party Piece classes are intended to be a fun, informal opportunity for anyone aged 6 or under on the 1st September 2023 to come and have a go at performing in a friendly and informal setting. These are non-competitive classes and comments from the adjudicator will be supportive and age-appropriate. No places will be awarded and everyone will receive a small prize for entering.

Class 000 will take place on Saturday 9th March and class 001 will take place on Saturday 16th March. Timings to be confirmed once entries received. Entrants may also be interested in class 824 which is the party piece for Musical Theatre and will take place on Sunday 3rd March.

Performances in these classes do not need to be accompanied but if thy are, 'live' accompaniment is preferred. However, if you use a backing track this must be uploaded to PlayandPerform by Monday 19th February 2024. Please note the additional information as you make the entry.

#### STRING Syllabus

These classes are intended to take place on Saturday 9th March 2024. \*Times and dates of all classes are subject to confirmation once all entries have been received. The committee reserve the right to combine and/or separate classes dependent upon the number of entries received.\*

Performers should introduce their own choice of piece(s) at the beginning of their performance. Timings should include introduction and any breaks between pieces. A copy of all own choice pieces must be provided for the adjudicator. Unless otherwise stated, these are competitive classes and places will be awarded. Non-competitive classes can be found at the end of this section.

#### String Solo

Solo performers may enter only the class most appropriate for their playing standard and the open class for each instrument in each competitive section. However, performers may make further entries to the same class if playing more than one instrument and may enter non-competitive classes in addition. Different piece(s) must be played or performed for each entry.

In classes where the time limit is 5 minutes or less, ONE piece of the performer's own choice is to be performed. Where the time limit is 6 minutes or more, one OR two pieces of the performer's own choice may be performed within the time limit for the class.

In addition, performers may wish to enter the following special classes:

- Performers aged 6 years or under may wish to enter the Party Piece class.
- Performers who are Grade 6 standard or above AND were aged 12 years or under on 1st September 2023 may also wish to enter the Marian Baker Memorial Prize and Cup class.

## MUSICAL THEATRE Syllabus

Following the success of last year's WCAF Musical Theatre day, the sections this year will be on Sunday 3rd March, with exciting professional workshops taking place alongside the competitive and non-competitive sections. \*Times and dates of all classes are subject to confirmation once all entries have been received. The committee reserve the right to combine and/or separate classes dependent upon the number of entries.\*

Entries in these sections should be songs that are sung by characters in musicals, in films or in plays. They may combine song, spoken dialogue and movement and/or dance to tell a story. The adjudicator will take into account all elements as part of the overall performance, including the suitability of the song for the age, vocal range and voice of the performer.

Please note that the ages for the classes below are the age of the performer on 1st September 2023. If you have any queries about age categories, please do not hesitate to contact us to discuss, as we want to make it as easy as possible to enter.

All performances in these classes should be accompanied and 'live' accompaniment is preferred. However, if you use a backing track this must be uploaded to PlayandPerform by Monday 19th February 2024. Backing tracks must not contain backing vocals or any vocal line. Please note the additional information as you make the entry.

Performers should introduce their own choice of piece(s) at the beginning of their performance. The introduction should include the performer's name, song title, the show from which the song comes and the name of the character who sings it. More information may be included within the time limit for the class. Timings should include introduction and any breaks between pieces. A copy of all own choice pieces must be provided for the adjudicator. Unless otherwise stated, these are competitive classes and places will be awarded. Non-competitive classes can be found at the end of this section.

Scenery and hand-held props may be used, as long as the performer can carry everything on to stage themselves in one attempt. A suggestion of costume (including makeup) may be worn. However, the use of scenery, costume and makeup are optional and will not affect the mark given.

Unacceptable Language Thresholds: Some works performed explore adult themes and/or contain strong language. However, care should be taken when choosing pieces. We ask that you present your work in a manner that respects the 'family' orientated nature of the festival and avoids the unnecessary exposure of younger children to inappropriate themes and language. Therefore, all entrants to the speech, drama and musical theatre sections are asked to confirm whether their performance contains adult language or content upon entry. Four letter words (e.g. f\*\*\*) should be replaced by milder expletives and such expletives should be used only sparingly. The festival aims to celebrate the best and highest forms of literature and language and therefore reserves the right to refuse entries that are made up of continuously bad language and/or gratuitous expletives.

Performers are reminded that due to Performing Rights restrictions, no costume or scenery may be used but movement and basic props are allowed. The following items are acceptable -scarves/shawls, headwear, gloves, fans and other hand-held small items. Mobile phones, kindles, iPads, e-readers and laptops are not permitted unless they are required for the use of music and/or sound effects or as a hand prop. Performers should NOT wear stage makeup. Competitors are allowed to provide their own prompts.

The Festival has an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or SOLO dramatic item. Duologues and group dramatic activity are NOT covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.

Unacceptable Language Thresholds: Some works performed explore adult themes and/or contain strong language. However, care should be taken when choosing or devising contemporary pieces. We ask that you present your work in a manner that respects the 'family' orientated nature of the festival and avoids the unnecessary exposure of younger children to inappropriate themes and language. Therefore, all entrants to the speech, drama and musical theatre sections are now asked to confirm whether their performance contains adult language or content upon entry. If you indicate you have potentially contentious language or themes, a representative from WCAF will be in contact to discuss and a copy of the piece as you intend to perform it must be sent prior to the festival. Four letter words (e.g. f\*\*\*) must be replaced by milder expletives, and such expletives should be used only sparingly. The festival aims to celebrate the best and highest forms of literature and language, and therefore reserves the right to refuse entries that are made up of continuously bad language and/or gratuitous expletives.
