We will be holding our next festival in February 2026 and entries need to be received by the end of December 2025. We welcome entrants to the festival from performers of any age and ability. This is an excellent opportunity to perform live, and showcase and hone your talent in a friendly and encouraging environment. All entrants will receive a written and verbal assessment from a professional adjudicator, plus a certificate, and most winners will receive a cup. We also have a number of cash prizes to reward the best entrants ranging from £25 to £500.

Please have a look at the syllabus - you will see we offer a very wide range of classes covering choirs and bands, solo and ensemble singing, piano, instrumental, and speech and drama. If you have any questions about the festival, please get in touch. In the syllabus you will find the contact details for the convenors of each section.

General Rules and Regulations

WHO MAY PERFORM

The Stratford & East London Music Festival is open to amateurs only, except the Open Classes which are also open to professionals. An amateur is considered as one who does not derive the main part of their income from the subject entered. Students under 19 years of age are considered to be amateurs for the purposes of the competitions.

AGE LIMITS: Where age limits apply, they refer to the age the competitor will be on 31st August 2026 (the end of the academic year), thereby making the 'xx years and under' categories more relevant to individual entrants than they were previously. For example, children who turn 11 during the 2025-26 academic year may perform in classes for 11 years and under; those turning 17 may perform in classes for 17 years and under, and so on. For group entries, the class is determined by the age of the oldest competitor in the group, unless the class is 'Open'.

Unless otherwise stated, competitors may perform only once in each class, except in duet, trio or ensemble classes where a competitor may perform more than once, provided that a different part is performed. Solo competitors may not enter a class if, for three consecutive years, they have been the winner of that class. Solo competitors may not enter a class if they have received tuition from the adjudicator in the last two years. Conductors may not sing with their choirs.

HOW TO ENTER

All entries must be received by 31st December 2025.

Entry fees cannot be refunded except for classes cancelled by the decision of the Committee. The Trustees are prepared to offer limited assistance with travel costs in the case of hardship for Junior and Infant School Choirs only. Please contact the Festival Secretary.

DATA PROTECTION

Under the terms of GDPR, the Stratford & East London Music Festival undertakes not to pass on any information about competitors or members, and to use such information only for the purpose of the Festival.

BEFORE THE EVENT

Information will be sent to competitors at least ten days before the date of the competition. The Committee reserves the right to limit, cancel or subdivide any class, to combine two similar classes, or to transfer classes from one day to another. In exceptional circumstances, there may be a change of adjudicator.

THE PERFORMANCE

Only stewards, performers and their accompanists will be guaranteed access to the performing area. Copies of 'own choice' pieces must be handed to the adjudicator's steward before their performance. The Festival is bound by copyright law and cannot allow video, mobile phone or any form of recording equipment to be used during performances - it is in breach of copyright and is an offence. The individual as well as the Festival may be fined. In the large group competitions held at St Mary's Church, photographs may be taken of the group at the end of each performance, provided that this complies with parent's wishes and/or the individual school's policy on this matter. In all other sections, only officials of the Festival may take photographs. Please refer to the Child Protection Policy for further information.

ADJUDICATION

The adjudicators' decisions are final. Awards may be withheld if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, sufficient merit is not shown. No entrant, teacher or interested party may discuss any aspect of the Festival with an adjudicator before, during or after classes, except at the invitation of the adjudicator. Adjudications and certificates are normally available at the end of each class. Competitors who do not perform at the scheduled time will not receive any marks.

MARKING SYSTEM

First prize winners gaining 84% or above are awarded either trophies or medals. In classes where there are ten or more entries, a second place medal is awarded. The British and International Federation of Festivals has agreed the following descriptors for use by adjudicators, and certificates will be awarded as follows:

Exceptional: 95%+ - A superlative performance, displaying exceptional artistic individuality

Outstanding: 90% to 94% - An impressive performance technically and artistically, displaying spontaneity and clear individuality

Honours: 85% to 89% - An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality

Commended: 80% to 84% - A competent performance, showing some artistic awareness and/or technical ability

Merit: 75% to 79% - A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/ or technical

ability

Progressing: 70% to 74% - A performance showing development of technique and/or communication and commitment

Developing: 65% to 69% - A performance demonstrating an awareness of technical skills, requiring more consistency and artistry

TIME LIMITS

Time limits must be observed. If a competitor chooses to introduce their item, this must be included in the overall time limit where set. The performance may be stopped if the time limit is exceeded, and over-long performances will not be eligible for any prize.

OWN CHOICE PIECES

Full details of the title and composer/author of 'own choice' items must be shown on the entry form. Any competitor who does not perform their stated choice as printed in the programme will receive adjudication but will NOT receive marks or a certificate or be eligible for any prize. Likewise, any competitor who fails to provide a copy of their 'own choice' piece will receive adjudication but will NOT receive marks or a certificate. Competitors may not perform the same 'own choice' in more than one class, except for the Millennium Classes.

COPYRIGHT

For Speech & Drama competitors, it is not necessary to seek copyright permission to perform poetry, prose or solo dramatic items. Competitors entering duologues and group dramatic activity classes must contact publishers for permission to perform and pay the required fee. Competitors must produce evidence of copyright clearance. Items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance. Words or gender of a character must not be changed. For Music competitors, if the 'own choice' composition is from a large publication and the piece is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of the adjudicator. The copy will be retained and destroyed after the competition. The accompanist should always be given a printed copy of the music. Music which has been downloaded from the internet must be accompanied by the permission statement which accompanies the music.

ACCOMPANIST

Performers are invited to provide their own accompanist but, if preferred, there is an official accompanist available. The availability of an official accompanist is subject to competitors stating on the entry form that they require this service. There is an additional fee and this must be sent with the entry. It is generally possible to have a short run-through in the hour preceding the class. Most music can be handed to the accompanist on the day of the competition. More advanced pieces (eg Lieder, Recital and Grade 5 and above) should be sent to the Accompanist Coordinator, 5 Benrek Close, Ilford, Essex, IG6 2QL. The accompaniments supplied must be in the correct key. The use of a backing track is acceptable, provided that it does not infringe any copyright restrictions. The competitor should bring their own equipment on which to play the backing track.

If the piece to be performed has a written accompaniment, then it should not be performed unaccompanied.

TROPHIES

Trophies and/or medals will normally be presented at the end of the class. Trophies which are awarded for the highest marks in a particular section will be presented during the Young Musician Competition on the evening of Saturday 21st February 2026. All cups and trophies remain the property of the Stratford & East London Music Festival. They are held by the winners for eleven months and must be returned before 10 January 2027. Winners must sign for receipt of the cup or trophy, and are required to enter into a bond of safe custody of the item, and to bear the cost if they wish to have their names engraved on it.

ADMISSION TO COMPETITIONS

Competitors and their accompanists are admitted without charge. Children of school age and competitors' music/drama teachers are admitted without charge. Friends of the Stratford & East London Music Festival are admitted without charge. Other visitors will be required to pay a small fee for admission.

All classes have a time limit of ten minutes. Please remember to give the number in each group on the entry form.

Where an own choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works which is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of the adjudicator provided that the choir has already purchased its own copy. The photocopy made will be retained and destroyed immediately after the event.

The accompanist should always be given a printed copy - it is illegal to perform from photocopies of published music.

In the case of junior and infant choirs, if the piece is improvised or taught by ear then the requirement to provide a copy can be waived. In all other cases, a copy must be provided in order to receive an adjudication.

All pieces in this section can be played with or without accompaniment, or they can be accompanied by a backing track.

Adjudicator

Adrian Goss BMus(Hons)(Dunelm), ARAM, GRSM, FTCL, LRAM, LGSM, ARCO(CHM)

Adrian studied at the RAM & the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. After an initial career as accompanist and clarinettist, he quickly established himself as a Tenor. His work as a singer has included concerts, recitals, recordings and broadcasts, and in 1999 he was awarded the ARAM, an honour granted to past students of the Academy who have achieved distinction in their profession. A former Lay-clerk at Ely Cathedral, deputy at St Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey and HM Chapel Royal, a member of the City Glee Club, Director of a chamber choir and work as a Director of Music at a major church has led him on to a parallel career in education.

Adrian has been Director of Music at two senior schools and also at the Kent Music Academy for the gifted, Head of Kent's County Groups and Staff Conductor, an examiner for grades and diplomas, and a vocal teacher from beginner to diploma level. He is increasingly in demand as a vocal troubleshooter. In addition to his successful solo singing career, Adrian directs workshops and masterclasses for singers and speakers at summer schools, and continues to work as an accompanist.

Adrian has 37 years' experience as an adjudicator for international, national and local festivals, including the National Festival of Music for Youth. He was elected a member of the BIFF

Adjudicators' Council in 2010, and became Chairman for ten years from 2014. In 2024 Adrian's work and commitment were recognised by the prestigious award following election as an adjudicator Fellow of the British & International Federation of Festivals for an outstanding contribution over many years to the Federation and the festival movement.

Adjudicator

Kay Tucker AGSM, ARCM, LTCL, PGCA, PGCE

Kay was born in Sheffield, Yorkshire and began her studies on the cello at the age of 12, continuing at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Her portfolio career has combined teaching and adjudicating with performing as a soloist, chamber musician and orchestral player.

Since 1998, Kay has been in popular demand as an adjudicator throughout the UK, having worked at well over 200 festivals including the National Festival of Music for Youth.

'Encouragement' is a key word in all aspects of Kay's work and she has great joy in working alongside musicians of all ages, particularly the very young.

Kay's passion for teaching led her to develop an early years strings & general musicianship system known as 'Stringbabies', which has become well established and accepted as a leading approach in strings teaching. In 2016, Musicbabies for Recorder was published, being the first adaptation of Stringbabies for a non-stringed instrument.

Over recent years, Kay has worked as a consultant to Trinity Guildhall, selecting and co-selecting repertoire for graded exams and diplomas. She has been a Trustee and member of the Executive Council of the European String Teacher's Association (ESTA), and was presented with the ESTA award for exceptional services in recognition of her work in initiating the Post Graduate Certificate in string teaching accredited by Chichester University.

Adjudicator

Ben Costello MA, BMus, PgDip

Ben is a freelance musical director, adjudicator, singing coach and accompanist, working internationally. He is Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, and a generalist music adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals, having joined in 2009. He is also a music examiner for LCME and is a consultant on their musical theatre syllabi.

A specialist in musical theatre, he has been musical director for numerous productions across the UK, and a reflective product of this has been his continuing work as a musical director and singing teacher at the cutting edge of performing arts training in London. Many of his former singing students enjoy highly successful careers in the West End and beyond, and besides working at many prestigious training establishments Ben also teaches singing at Kingston Grammar School and Tiffin Girls' School.

Ben remains much sought-after as an accompanist, and collaborates in a variety of genres with countless singers and instrumentalists in many performing environments, working with distinguished singers including Michael Chance CBE, James Bowman CBE, Robin Blaze, Hugh Cutting, Alison Pearce, Joanne Lunn and Peter Savidge. He is one of the regular pianists for Cantabile (The London Quartet), and has given international concerts with them.

Ben is a Liveryman and on the Court of the Worshipful Company of Musicians. He chaired the Company's prestigious annual musical direction scholarship for eight years, and is presently

Chairman of the Company's Jazz Committee.

Born and based in London, Ben trained initially as a flautist before majoring in piano, singing and conducting. He read Music at Kingston University and the London College of Music, subsequently joining the teaching staff as the College's first resident MD. Outside of music, Ben is a keen motorcyclist and wine buff.

Andrew Hansford holds music degrees from multiple universities in the UK. A performing classical pianist specialising in piano accompaniment from relatively early on in his career, he is also an organist, harpsichordist and a choral singer.

In addition to working as an active international BIFF Music Adjudicator, Andrew has been a committed and experienced piano/jazz piano tutor since 1990, teaching all ages from beginner-level to an advanced diploma-level. He has also examined and mentored for the ABRSM and for Trinity College London.

Currently researching for a doctorate, Andrew has previously undertaken postgraduate research on the subject of 'A Study of the (Christmas) Carol' for his own curiosity and interest, and he also continues to enjoy occasional advanced piano accompaniment studies at the Royal College of Music as part of his own ongoing professional development.

Andrew has always had a real affinity for both choral and vocal music (especially English Song as a piano accompanist), nurtured since beginning his musical life at a UK Cathedral Choir School, and he takes special pleasure in accompanying choirs, choral ensembles and singers. He is also one of the resident organists at a local church in Oxfordshire near to where he lives. Particularly adept in the art of music improvisation and having also periodically explored composition (which has led to a number of non-published/personal compositions to date), his preferred choice of instrument for his performance as a piano accompanist is a Steinway Model D.

Since 1998, Kay has been in popular demand as an adjudicator throughout the UK, having worked at well over 200 festivals including the National Festival of Music for Youth.

'Encouragement' is a key word in all aspects of Kay's work and she has great joy in working alongside musicians of all ages, particularly the very young.

Kay's passion for teaching led her to develop an early years strings & general musicianship system known as 'Stringbabies', which has become well established and accepted as a leading approach in strings teaching. In 2016, Musicbabies for Recorder was published, being the first adaptation of Stringbabies for a non-stringed instrument.

Over recent years, Kay has worked as a consultant to Trinity Guildhall, selecting and co-selecting repertoire for graded exams and diplomas. James now appears regularly as a recitalist and concerto soloist throughout the UK and Europe. Highlights include performances at London's Wigmore Hall and the Edinburgh and Aldeburgh Festivals.

He has appeared as concerto soloist with the English, Scottish and Belarusian Chamber Orchestras, the Moscow, Kazakh, Astana and Penang Symphony Orchestras, the Arad and Oradea Philharmonic Orchestras (Romania), in venues including the Royal Albert Hall and Royal Opera House in London, Symphony Hall, Birmingham, the Great Hall of the Moscow Conservatoire and Astana Opera House. He has performed both Brahms Concertos in Russia and Romania.

James is a member of the Barbican Piano Trio, whose highlights include many cycles of Beethoven's complete Piano Trios including the Master Concert Series at Wigmore Hall. He also enjoyed a long collaboration with the celebrated Russian violinist Lydia Mordkovitch, amongst many others.

James is a dedicated teacher and holds posts at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, Royal Holloway, University of London, and Eton College. He is a regular jury member of international piano competitions and is much in demand for masterclasses and as an adjudicator.

Adrian Goss BMus(Hons)(Dunelm), ARAM, GRSM, FTCL, LRAM, LGSM, ARCO(CHM)

Adrian studied at the RAM & the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. After an initial career as accompanist and clarinettist, he quickly established himself as a Tenor. His work as a singer has included concerts, recitals, recordings and broadcasts, and in 1999 he was awarded the ARAM, an honour granted to past students of the Academy who have achieved distinction in their profession. A former Lay-clerk at Ely Cathedral, deputy at St Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey and HM Chapel Royal, a member of the City Glee Club, Director of a chamber choir and work as a Director of Music at a major church has led him on to a parallel career in education.

Adrian has been Director of Music at two senior schools and also at the Kent Music Academy for the gifted, Head of Kent's County Groups and Staff Conductor, an examiner for grades and diplomas, and a vocal teacher from beginner to diploma level. He is increasingly in demand as a vocal troubleshooter. In addition to his successful solo singing career, Adrian directs workshops and masterclasses for singers and speakers at summer schools, and continues to work as an accompanist.

Adrian has 37 years' experience as an adjudicator for international, national and local festivals, including the National Festival of Music for Youth. He was elected a member of the BIFF Adjudicators' Council in 2010, and became Chairman for ten years from 2014. In 2024 Adrian's work and commitment were recognised by the prestigious award following election as an adjudicator Fellow of the British & International Federation of Festivals for an outstanding contribution over many years to the Federation and the festival movement.
