TROPHIES AND AWARDS

Hastings Musical Festival's prestigious Gold, Silver and Bronze medal classes will be held this year. These beautiful medals have been awarded for many years and are only awarded at the highest level in Medal Classes.

Hastings Musical Festival also award trophies to the winners of many classes and there are special aggregate trophies awarded in all sections.

We will again be awarding First, Second and Third place awards to entrants under 18 with the exception of our Gold, Silver and Bronze medal classes. Note that although the place awards are Gold, Silver and Bronze in colour they do not equate to our Festival Medals.

SPECIAL TROPHIES

As well as trophies awarded for individual classes, the Festival awards a number of Special Trophies for marks achieved over specific combinations of classes, or on the recommendation of adjudicators. These trophies will be presented at the end of the festival in a Trophy Presentation ceremony, before the Festival Finale Concert.

GRANTS AND BURSARIES

GRANTS TO PERFORMING ARTS STUDENTS - We continue to offer Grants in 2024 and are very proud of our record of supporting our entrants in this way.

Every year the Hastings Musical Festival, which is a registered charity, distributes substantial sums to aspiring performers to help them to undertake a course of professional study if they have been regular competitors in the Festival. The applicants must meet certain criteria and the amounts awarded are governed by the number of applicants and the income from the Festival and investments. These grants, for students who have a course of study arranged, will be made at the discretion of the Grants Committee.

Application forms are available from the General Secretary by email: info@hastingsmf.org.uk. All applications should be submitted by 30th April 2024 for academic courses commencing in September 2024.

Applications will be considered by the Trustees at a meeting in May and all applicants will be notified of the result of their applications by the end of June.

CONDITIONS

Applicants must have taken part in the Hastings Musical Festival in at least three different years of the last five years.

Applicants will be required to provide evidence of their intention to take up their subject (music, speech and drama, or dance) professionally, either as teacher or performer. No grant will be forwarded until proof of attendance at their course at a recognised dance or theatre school or academy is received.

Applicants must be over 16 years of age.

Grants will not be awarded for payment of equipment or class fees paid outside school whilst a student is still studying at sixth form school or college.

All applicants must be willing for details of the awards to be published on the Festival website and for their names and photographs to be used for press and publicity purposes.

Applicants are required to send an annual update on their course and how they are developing as performers.

Decisions regarding grants will be made by The Grants Committee and their decision is final.

BURSARIES

THE MOLLY TOWNSON BURSARY

This Bursary will be awarded annually by The Management Committee of Hastings Musical Festival to support a young person intending to pursue a career in the performing arts.

THE JOHN AND IRENE FOSTER CHARITABLE TRUST BURSARY

This Bursary will be awarded by the Trustees of the John and Irene Foster Charitable Trust to a student for a course of study in music or the performing arts at a recognised school or academy, or for arts related courses at a university. Bursaries may also be given for other items at the discretion of the Trustees

The student must be resident in East Sussex.

The Grants Committee, appointed by The Management Committee, will recommend a number of applicants who have applied to the Festival for grants each year. Their details, as supplied to Hastings Musical Festival, will be forwarded to the Trustees of the John and Irene Foster Charitable Trust who will make their decision based on the information supplied. No further application form is required.

General Rules and Regulations

1 Please examine the General Rules and Regulations carefully. All performers should also study the particular requirements of each subject and class for which they wish to enter. Regulations must be observed.

Infringement of any rule of the Festival will result in disqualification.

- 2 The Festival is intended mainly for Amateurs, who are defined for this purpose as persons who do not derive their livelihood from the branch of performance, defined by the class title, in which they seek to enter the Festival. In any ensemble, all members must adhere to this principle. Anyone else is deemed Professional and may only enter OPEN classes.
- 3 Dates given in the Syllabus are provisional. The final timetable and details of class times will be decided once all entries have been received. This will be available online in January.
- 4 No competitor may compete more than once in any class, unless stated in the Syllabus. Please check individual Sections for variations.
- 5 No substitution of one name for another in the programme is permitted except in duet or trio classes, or at the discretion of the Section Secretary. Any performer whose name does not appear in the correct class in the programme will not be allowed to perform without a special permit from the Festival Office.
- 6 Important Please Note A competitor's age will be reckoned as on the 31st August of the previous year.
- 7 No competitor may enter a class reserved for older persons. Occasionally, in the Silver or Gold Medal classes and in duets, duos and duologues, performers may legitimately enter a class although they are younger than the minimum age. Please check individual Sections for variations.
- 8 Past Prize winners in any Medal Class are not eligible to compete in the same class again. If a Solo Challenge Cup is won three years in succession, they are also entitled to claim a miniature cup. See section rules for any exceptions.
- 9 We aim to be inclusive and will make every effort to accommodate particular needs of competitors. Please let us know if you require wheelchair access.
- 10 In the Instrumental and Speech sections no 'own choice' piece may be chosen from test pieces set in the current syllabus. A competitor may not present any 'own choice' piece with which they have won a 1st place in the Hastings Festival in the past three years, except in Dancing classes, when a piece may be danced when it has been awarded a 1st place in previous years.

No competitor may offer the same piece in more than one class, except Medal dancing classes. Please see separate Sections for variations to this rule.

- 11 'Own Choice' copies of words and music (not applicable to dancing) must be handed in to the steward when requested. Please collect your music after the adjudication.
- 12 For 'Own Choice' pieces in any discipline, suitability must be considered with regard to age group. 'Adult' or offensive material is not acceptable and Adjudicators will be advised to take this into account when marking. They will also have the authority to stop any performance at their discretion, which would lead to disqualification of the competitor(s).

- 13 In all classes with a time limit, any extra time taken will be penalised. Details of penalties vary in each Section and are available from the relevant Section Secretary.
- 14 Important Please Note Entries should be made using the online application process. All entries must be made and the correct entry fees paid before the closing date. Anyone experiencing difficulties or who is unable to make entries online should contact the relevant Section Secretary for assistance. Entry fees are not returnable unless the entry is rejected by the Festival. Accompanists and teachers will be provided with a free pass on the day.
- 15 Late entries may only be accepted after the closing date at the discretion of the Section Secretaries. A penalty fee will be charged (double the original entry fee). The General Secretary reserves the right to accept or reject any entry and cannot guarantee late entries will be included in the Programme.
- 16 All entrants (or their parents/teachers) must read the conditions of entry carefully together with our Child Protection, Safeguarding and Photography Policies.
- 17 All withdrawals should be notified to the Festival Office as soon as the information is known to assist with timetabling of classes. Entry fees are not refundable.
- 18 Punctuality is essential for all classes. All competitors must be prepared to arrive at the beginning of the session so that classes may run smoothly and to time. The General Secretary and Section Secretaries reserve the right to alter times and to combine or cancel classes for operational reasons.
- 19 Communication with the Adjudicator by any unauthorised person before, during or after any class is not permitted. Enquiries during the competition should be addressed to the Section Secretary present whose decision is final.
- 20 The Adjudicator will take into account a competitor's dress, their overall demeanour, the manner in which they approach the stage and the way in which they announce their performance (if appropriate) as well as the technical content of the performance. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 21 The Adjudicator shall have full power to withhold any award in any class.

The number of marks required before an award can be made is as follows:

Gold Medal 90 For Cash Award 87

Silver Medal: Dancing 87 Other Disciplines 85 Bronze Medal 85

A First Award in any other Class 80 Certificates will be awarded as follows: Performance Certificate 75-80

A performance showing development of technique and/or communication

Merit Certificate 81-83

A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or

technical ability

Special Merit Certificate 84-86

A convincing performance technically and artistically

Honours Certificate 87+

An excellent performance technically and artistically; 90+ denoting an

exceptional performance

For an aggregate trophy it is sufficient for a minimum of 85 to be achieved in only one of the component classes. The Adjudicator's decision is FINAL. In Dancing Classes, marks given in Medal

Classes do not count towards Aggregate Awards.

Class Trophies require a winning mark of 85 if they are to be presented, with the exception of Babies Dancing Classes where the trophy will be awarded regardless of the winning mark.

- 22 Certificates and Adjudicators' notes will be distributed by the Section Secretary as soon as possible after the finish of the class, except in the dancing section where they will be available from the Festival Office or from the Festival Desk in the Lower Foyer. They may be posted by arrangement and on payment of a small fee. All unclaimed certificates and mark sheets will be disposed of one month after the end of the Festival.
- 23 Most Medals, Trophies and Aggregate Cups will be presented by the Adjudicator during the Festival where possible. Those not awarded during the Festival will be presented at a separate ceremony.

Winners are responsible for engraving and returning their Trophies by the end of January before the next Festival. They should be handed in to the Festival Office at the White Rock Theatre, or at the Theatre Box Office if the Festival Office is not open. Returned trophies must be clearly labelled with the name and address of the winners. It is important to return trophies on time to enable them to be prepared for presentation. Late return may affect future winners.

- 24 The Festival Finale is held at the end of the Festival. A selection of outstanding items seen during the Festival is presented during this concert. Performances are chosen to give a balanced and entertaining programme and reflect all aspects of the Festival. It is not possible to invite all winners to participate. Aggregate trophies not given during the Festival will be presented at a separate Trophy Ceremony earlier in the day of the Finale concert
- 25 The taking of photographs or use of any audio or video recording equipment, including mobile phones, is strictly prohibited within the auditoriums or from the wings of the stage of the White Rock Theatre as it will breach child safeguarding guidelines and disturb the performers.
- 26 Copyright. Recording, photography and making videos of performances is forbidden under copyright law and may lead to prosecution. Photocopies of set pieces are not allowed. Where an 'own choice' piece has been taken from an album, a copy may be supplied for the use of the adjudicator provided that the competitor or accompanist uses an original copy and the photocopy is retained and destroyed by the Festival organisers after the class. There are special rules which apply to each discipline. Please refer to the separate sections.
- N.B. All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law. Songs from shows in current production may be sung as a concert item i.e. with no costume or movement without need for copyright permission. Where movement or costume is included copyright permission is required and the Festival accepts these entries on the basis that the appropriate copyright permission has been sought. Performers or teachers with queries on how to obtain permission for performance items should contact Festivals House on 01625 428297 before making their entries.
- 27 All enquiries or complaints should be made immediately after the competition to the relevant Section Secretary in the Hall. Please see our complaints policy available on the website. If you are not satisfied that your complaint has been dealt with, it will be referred to the General Secretary. Dance Syllabus

Welcome to the Syllabus for the 2024 Hastings Musical Festival Dance Section! The proposed dates are Sunday 3th March to Thursday 14th March 2024. This is an All England Qualifying Festival this year.

Please note that the ages for duet, trio, quartet and group classes have been reinstated to 10 and under, 14 and under and 21 and under, as agreed with All England Dance.

National dance is now called Global. Song and Dance is now Musical Theatre and Character is now Narrative/Character.

This year we will continue using our original marking scheme.

Duets- dancers can only dance once per class.

Trio/quartets- dancers can only dance once in each class.

Groups- 3 groups per dance school per class and the same dancers can only be in a maximum of 2 dances.

In the Gold Medal class you do not have to qualify. If the winner achieves a mark of 87, then the Phyllis Godfrey trophy is presented and a prize of £150, the Gold medal will only be awarded if the dancer achieves 90 in both dancers.

The entry qualifications for entry to the Bronze medal you have to be aged 9,10 and 11yrs and will have to qualify by obtaining a mark of 83 in both ballet and character. For the Silver medal you are aged 12,13 and 14 yrs and will have to qualify with a mark of 85 in both ballet and character.

After looking at the Dance Syllabus please go to the Combined Syllabus where you will find the General Rules, which are applicable to all sections.

This year we will be asking all entrants to upload music and any synopsis on to playandperform. These can be added on the home page of the entry system. From there you can upload a music and Synopsis for each of your entries.

A new Trophy has been donated this year for Dancing Contemporary Group which will be the 'Milford Family Cup' presented by Vicki Milford, Rebecca Tromans and Claire Hart

Rules

1 Ballet: No pointe work is permitted for competitors under 13 years.

Musical Theatre (formally Song and Dance): There is no requirement for the performance to contain 50% song and 50% dance.

Narrative/Character: May be danced in any manner the subject demands and the technique must be appropriate to the character. Classical work only.

Global Dance (formally National): Must be authentic and belong to a recognised country.

Classical Greek: performed barefoot showing the use of opposition and relaxation through movement. Must be related to Lyric, Athletic, Bacchic, Pyrrhic, Choric, Ritual or Tragic.

Contemporary: Technically, work may reference recognised Contemporary technique and have a strong classical base. Work should show a reference to principles of contraction and release, fall and rebound, use of breath and gravity and successive or initiated movement. Only those dancers aged 13 and over can enter Contemporary solos, duets, trios and quartets.

2 Bronze and Silver Medals: In these classes, the Ballet and Character items must be those danced in the qualifying classes. The age qualifications for entry to the the Bronze Medal are 9, 10 and 11. The age qualifications in the Silver Medal are 12, 13 and 14. Please see syllabus for more details.

3 The age of the eldest competitor in duets, trios, quartets and groups determines the correct age group. AGE IS TAKEN FROM 31st AUGUST OF THE YEAR PRIOR TO THE FESTIVAL YEAR.

4 Props:

Only props which can be easily carried and quickly set in place by performers or helpers are allowed. Construction of scenery or props on the side of the stage is prohibited, as are real flowers, and leaves, confetti or talcum powder or similar. Props should not exceed 10 kgs in weight and should be fully integrated into the performance. They should be flame resistant.

5 Timing:

Entries in all classes which exceed the time limit will be penalised by the subtraction of marks. Time will be checked from the first note or word of the accompaniment, or the first movement of the dancer, whichever comes first, until the dancer's last movement at the completion of the dance.

6 Re-dance: Re-dance is allowed aged 9 and under

7 Singing:

No singing is allowed except in the Musical Theatre and Cabaret classes.

8 Chaperones:

All chaperones must be over 18 years of age and must wear their badges at all times. CHILDREN MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CHAPERONE AT ALL TIMES

9 Footwear, Makeup and changing:

Footwear must be worn in all areas of the building at all times. Extreme care should be taken backstage and whenever possible, feet should be covered to avoid accidents.

The venue reminds you that changing, applying makeup etc is not allowed in the front of house, toilets, auditorium and restaurant.

10 Backstage Etiquette:

MOVEMENT BEHIND THE BACK CURTAIN IS NOT ALLOWED DURING A PERFORMANCE IF IN THE THEATRE

The Dancing Secretary and a chaperone will be present at the side of the stage at all times to ensure that dancers and chaperones are respectful to those performing. The numbers of those who have danced or waiting to dance will be restricted to avoid noise and overcrowding.

11 Recordings/ Backing Tracks and Synopsis

This year we are asking all entrants to upload their music and up to a 20 words synopsis to relevant dance classes (greek, character and national for solo, duets trio/ quartets, titles for small and large groups for modern, lyrical, tap, musical theatre and contemporary). Music and synopsis can be uploaded on the homepage of the entry system.

12 Classes:

Should classes be over or undersubscribed, then the Dancing Secretary may choose to divide or combine classes.

13 The Adjudicator for 2024 is Jill Baldock

Provisional dates are Sunday 3rd March to Thursday 14th March 2024

PLEASE NOTE: For the Dance Section, after 31st December late entries will only be accepted if there is time in the scheduling, even if a double fee is paid. Should the entries be high, the Dancing Secretary may choose to close entries before this date.

14 Song and Dance:

All performers using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law. Songs from shows in current production may be sung as a concert item (i.e. no costume or movement) without need for copyright permission. The Festival Committee accepts entries on the basis that appropriate copyright permission has been sought by the performer or teacher.

There will be no microphones in use for Song and Dance, Cabaret or Tap classes.

Backing tracks which include singing are not permitted.

15 Gold Medal: This is not a qualifying class. A prize of £150 will be awarded to the winner if a mark of 87 or above has been awarded. A mark of 90 is required for the Gold Medal to be awarded.

- 16 Duets- dancers can only dance once in each section
- 17 Trio/Quartets- dancers can only dance once in each section
- 18 3 groups per school per class can be entered and the same dancers can only be in 2 groups per class.
- 19 This year is an All England Festival. Dancers date of birth is taken from the 31st August the year prior to the festival. (2023).
- 20 Every person escorting dancers must purchase a ticket as they enter the theatre.

Dance schools will be given 2 teacher passes each day and will be asked for names for each day before the festival begins.

Adjudicators

Jill Baldock

Qualifications: LIDTA, ARAD

Jill has a love and passion for all things theatrical. Her vast and full career has given her the knowledge and desire to inspire the next generation of performers.

Her training started at the Hylton Bromley School in Merseyside, where she gained several scholarships from the I.D.T.A. and continued her training at the Royal Academy of Dance and the Place (London's Contemporary School). During her early years Jill entered The Sunshine All England Competitions and gained 7 solo gold medals in the London Finals receiving the Sunshine, the Modern and the National Trophies. She was also invited to be a part of the Beryl Grey

Workshops.

Jill worked as a professional dancer/performer for many years in TV, Film, Cabaret and the West End - shows included "Kiss Me Kate", "Carousel", "The King and I", "Oklahoma", "Fiddler on the Roof" and many more. She went on to become an international choreographer, director and producer of theatre and cabaret shows. Producing pantos, cruise shows, children's plays, summer seasons, even Shakespeare! At the same time developing her own theatrical/management agency. Her love of teaching took her back to the studio and worked for the Italia Conti School, the Arts Council, Pineapple, whilst running her own performing arts school.

She then diverted her career into the music business, producing for EMI, Virgin, Carlton and recorded many artistes - Shirley Bassey, Howard Keel, Petula Clarke, the London Philharmonic and many, many more. She had the honour of producing the official recording for the Queen Mother's 100th birthday. During that time her music publishing & production company was awarded the coveted Ivor Novello Award.

Rules

- 1 There will be no practising on the stage or piano before or during sessions.
- 2 Photocopies may not be used for performances. They may only be used by adjudicators and will be destroyed at the end of the session.
- 3 The following notes on Medals apply to all groups within the Instrumental Section. Past prize winners in any Medal Class are not eligible to compete in the same class again.

Performers may not enter more than one medal class in the same instrumental section.

Medals will only be awarded if the winner achieves the following minimum marks: Gold Medal 90; Silver and Bronze Medals 85.

Gold Medal winners are eligible for free entry into Class 3604, Hastings Young Instrumentalist of the Year.

- 4 Entrants should provide their own music stands.
- 5 Photography and filming are strictly forbidden during a performance and could lead to disqualification of the performer.
- 6 All performers must be the stated age for their class on 1st September 2023. In some classes we have added the school year to which this age group applies.
- 7 It is important that the General Rules and regulations in this syllabus are read carefully, particularly those which refer to 'pieces'.

Rules

1 Please read these rules carefully - they may change from year to year. Any variation from these rules may result in disqualification. Also see the General Regulations. Age Limits: we have standardised the date across all the Sections so that all competitors must now be the stated age for their class on 31st August 2023

In some classes we have added the school year to which this age group applies.

2 Dates:

Dates for Singing Classes are: Monday 11th March to Saturday 16th March inclusive. Friday 14th is Primary Showcase Choir in Main Hall and other classes in Sussex Hall Friday 15th March is Choirs Day.

3 Dress/Costume:

Appropriate dress for appearing on stage is encouraged!

No Costumes allowed unless otherwise stated. Props are only allowed for certain classes, and this will be shown in the syllabus.

4 Use of copies:

Solo Singers are expected to memorise their songs except in Oratorio classes (Classes 2160 and 2162) or in Class 2038 (Seniors age 60 and under 70), and Class 2040 (Seniors age 70 and over) when copies can be used.

Choirs competing in classes 2204,2206, 2208 and 2210 are permitted to use copies if necessary. Other choirs should sing from memory.

Copies of the music being used in all classes, apart from Pop Vocals, are to be handed in at the adjudicator's table before the commencement of the relevant class.

5 Own Choice pieces:

The same song may not be sung in different classes by the same performer, unless specifically stated in the syllabus.

For "Own Choice" pieces, suitability must be considered with regard to age group. "Adult" or offensive material is not acceptable and the Adjudicators will be advised to take this into account when marking. They will also have authority to stop any performance at their discretion which would lead to disqualification.

In Junior singing classes (age under 18) own choices may be sung in any key, and transpositions are allowed.

6 Accompaniments:

Backing tracks, without any vocals on them, are permitted in Pop Vocals and choir classes. For all other classes, live piano accompaniment is to be used, unless otherwise stated.

7 Non-transferable entries and substitutes:

Teachers please note: Solo entries are not transferable, although substitutes are permitted in duet, trio and ensemble classes.

Adjudicator

Neil Jenkins

Neil has been singing all his life, joining his first choir at the age of 6. He was a Chorister at Westminster Abbey, and then a Choral Scholar at King's College Cambridge. Whilst there he was the first tenor in the vocal group 'The Kings Singers', and sang in the first concerts given by John Eliot Gardiner's 'Monteverdi Choir'. He has been singing professionally for more than 50 years, having made his debut at London's South Bank centre in 1967. He is now an internationally renowned tenor, conductor and music editor and has recorded over 60 discs of opera, oratorio and song with many of the world's leading conductors and musicians, including Benjamin Britten, Leonard Bernstein, Alfred Deller, Riccardo Chailly, Sir Charles Mackerras, Sir Andrew Davies, Sir Roger Norrington, Sir Neville Marriner, Richard Hickox, Andrew Parrott, Kent Nagano and Hans Werner Henze.

In the 1970s he was appointed as an RCM singing professor by Sir David Willcocks, for whom he became a regular soloist with the London Bach Choir, especially as the Evangelist in the Bach Passions, performed annually at the Royal Festival Hall.

Neil has carved out a unique career, being equally at home as an Operatic, Oratorio and Recital singer, combining this with an increasingly important role as a musicologist. He has translated and edited Bach's major choral works for the New Novello Choral Edition, and has produced other editions for OUP, Kevin Mayhew and Barn End Press. For 12 years he ran his own international summer school for singers every August, and now gives a regular series of master classes, is a well-known Music Festival adjudicator, and sits on international singing juries. Neil has written the biography of the Handelian singer and first great English tenor, John Beard, and recently curated an exhibition about the singer at the Handel House Museum. His memoirs were published by Barn End Press in May 2021.

Welcome to the 2024 Hastings Musical Festival Syllabus for Speech, Drama and Mime.

Thank you to all who took part in our 2023 Festival. We were pleased that the number of our entries overtook pre-pandemic levels and we enjoyed a very happy Festival with our adjudicator Vivienne Cunningham.

We are looking forward to welcoming Ann Bauer back to adjudicate in 2024, and we are delighted to be able to say that there will be trophies to be won in all classes for those aged under 19 in Speech Solos, Humorous Verse, Dramatic Monologue, Dramatic Duologue and Mime.

Read the Syllabus carefully as there are two brand new classes and adjustments have been made to some others in relation to age limits and School Year groupings.

There are over seventy Speech, Drama and Mime classes to choose from, and there are some special trophies encompassing all age groups for aggregate marks across two or three of the four genres: Poetry, Prose, Monologue and Mime; so you may wish to consider combinations of entries to give yourself opportunities to achieve these additional awards. There are also two aggregate awards for those aged under 13 for combinations of entries in Speech with Piano or Singing, and Speech with Dance.

If you are aged 19 or over or are a previous Silver Medal winner, do give serious thought to making an entry in the Speech Gold Medal class. Although, in this class, 90 must be achieved to be awarded the medal, there will be a cash prize of £150 for a winning mark of 87 or more.

Before looking at the Speech, Drama and Mime Syllabus, please go to the Combined Syllabus where you will find the General Rules, which are applicable to all sections, and information about our Special Trophies.

Shakespeare, in Hamlet, Act III, Scene 2, has some good advice to those entering this Section:

"Speak the speech, I pray you, as I pronounced it to you, trippingly on the tongue; but if you mouth it as many of your players do, I had as lief the town-crier spoke my lines. Nor do not saw the air too much with your hand, thus: but use all gently."

- 1 Dates The provisional dates for this section are 26th, 27th & 28th February 2024. Please check your programme for confirmation.
- 2 Presentation Credit will be given for choice of repertoire, presentation, dress and deportment, including a bow at the end of the performance. No Costume allowed, unless specified.
- 3 Age groups With the exception of Speech Medal classes, class 4016 and those designated 'Any Age', competitors aged under 16 should be entered for the class appropriate to their school year. Please also note that, for ALL classes, AGE IS TAKEN AS FROM 31ST AUGUST OF THE

PREVIOUS YEAR (2023).

Please ensure, for entrants under 19, that their date of birth is included in their details on the entry form.

- 4 Suitability of material For Own Choice pieces, suitability of content and language must be considered with regard to age group. The suitability of material is decided at the Adjudicator's discretion and must not contain profane or offensive words. "Adult" or offensive material is not acceptable and Adjudicators are advised to take this into account when marking. They also have authority to stop any performance at their discretion. This would lead to automatic disqualification.
- 5 Test pieces Test pieces, as indicated, have been taken from anthologies which have been named in the syllabus. All classes, including those for Prose Speaking, should be learnt, with the exception of classes for Original Verse (classes 4148 4158) which may be spoken or read. 'Own Choice' copies of words must be handed in to the steward when requested.
- 9 All performers are asked to bow at the conclusion of their piece.
- 7 Copyright The Hastings Musical Festival has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that performers do not have to seek permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed to a time limit of 10 minutes.

Dramatic Items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

Own Choice items - Please add the following information to the scripts that you hand in to the adjudicator's table for all solo own choice items (printed out or handwritten, on the copy, or firmly attached to it):

Author's first and last names;

Title of piece performed;

Title of book piece taken from;

ISBN number of book (if available)

This information is important as it has to be reported to The British and International Federation of Festivals (BIFF) for copyright purposes. Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in this festival means authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this festival.

Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.

- 6 Time Limits In all classes with a time limit, any extra time taken will be penalised by loss of marks. In Improvisation classes, any performance that does not fall within the range between the stated minimum and maximum time limits will be penalised by loss of marks.
- 8 All performers in group work must be within the specified age range.
- 10 Should classes be over or under subscribed, the Section Secretary may choose to divide or combine classes.

The Short Play classes are held in the Sussex Hall at the White Rock Theatre. This venue is a flexible space, and performers are invited to make creative use of it.

The Stage is 10m wide and 4m deep. Tabs are situated 2/3rds from the front of the stage and should be operated by the entrant. Lighting is a basic wash. There is no sound desk, but groups may use recorded sound effects or incidental music on their own CD/Cassette players or laptop.

There is no need for performers to feel confined to the stage area. Other areas of the Hall may also be used. On request, it is possible to rearrange seating to modify the performance area(s), so that, for example, presentations could be made "in the round".
