PLEASE NOTE - each piece may be used only once - i.e. not entered in more than one class in the Piano Section.

Attention pianists, please check out these other categories as you may wish to participate: Concerto Class, Confinemento and Millennium Competitions.

For 'own choice' classes, you must play your chosen piece as printed in the programme and must bring a copy of the music for the adjudicator. Any competitor who plays a different piece on the day, or who fails to provide a copy of their 'own choice' piece, will receive an adjudication but will NOT receive marks or a certificate.

## Adjudicator

### Andrew Hansford

BMus(Hons), BA(Hons), MA, MMus(Perf), MMus(Cantab), PGCert(OU), ARCM, ARCO, LRSM, LGSM, LTCL, FLCM

Andrew Hansford holds music degrees from multiple universities in the UK. A performing classical pianist specialising in piano accompaniment from relatively early on in his career, he is also an organist, harpsichordist and a choral singer.

In addition to working as an active international BIFF Music Adjudicator, Andrew has been a committed and experienced piano/jazz piano tutor since 1990, teaching all ages from beginner-level to an advanced diploma-level. He has also examined and mentored for the ABRSM and for Trinity College London.

Currently researching for a doctorate, Andrew has previously undertaken postgraduate research on the subject of 'A Study of the (Christmas) Carol' for his own curiosity and interest, and he also continues to enjoy occasional advanced piano accompaniment studies at the Royal College of Music as part of his own ongoing professional development.

Andrew has always had a real affinity for both choral and vocal music (especially English Song as a piano accompanist), nurtured since beginning his musical life at a UK Cathedral Choir School, and he takes special pleasure in accompanying choirs, choral ensembles and singers. He is also one of the resident organists at a local church in Oxfordshire near to where he lives. Particularly adept in the art of music improvisation and having also periodically explored composition (which has led to a number of non-published/personal compositions to date), his preferred choice of instrument for his

performance as a piano accompanist is a Steinway Model D.

## FELIX MARR AWARD (£500) AND EPTA CUP

The FELIX MARR AWARD of £500 will be awarded to the competitor gaining the highest mark in the open classes 301-309 (inclusive). In the event of a tie, the final decision will be made by the adjudicator. The value of the prize may be reduced if there are fewer than six entrants.

The prize will be presented in memory of Felix Marr (1947-2012) and the winner will be asked to perform during the final evening of the festival, Saturday 21st February 2026. Felix Marr's family intend that the award be used to support the further studies and development of exceptional entrants.

The EPTA UK Cup will be awarded to the most outstanding pianist aged 18 or under, as decided upon by the adjudicator.

### Open Piano Classes (any age)

The FELIX MARR AWARD of £500 will be awarded to the competitor gaining the highest mark in the open classes 301-309 (inclusive). In the event of a tie, the final decision will be made by the adjudicator. The value of the prize may be reduced if there are fewer than six entrants. The prize will be presented in memory of Felix Marr (1947-2012) and the winner will be asked to perform during the final evening of the festival, Saturday 21st February 2026.
