Attention Speech and Drama competitors. Please check out the Millennium Competitions as you may wish to participate.

The Forest School Trophy will be awarded for the most outstanding Speech and Drama performance in the 11-18 age group, as decided by the adjudicator. If the adjudicator feels that the winner was exceptional, then they will be eligible to receive a prize of £100 in further recognition of their achievement. The winner will be asked to perform again during the final evening of the festival, Saturday 22nd February 2025.

The Dacia Stevens Award will be awarded to the most promising Speech and Drama performer as judged by the adjudicator and will also be asked to perform again during the final evening of the festival, Saturday 22nd February 2025.

All pieces must be performed from memory, unless stated to the contrary.

Costume is optional and no marks are awarded for it. Simple props are permitted; chairs and small tables will be provided.

Competitors must adhere carefully to the time limits.

Verse speaking classes may incorporate occasional gestures in performance where deemed appropriate.

Clear copies of all pieces must be provided for the adjudicator

Adjudicator

George Logan

Born in Northern Ireland, George became an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals in 1983. Much of his career has been in education, working until 2015 mainly in the regulation and inspection of schools and children's services in the UK, both maintained and independent. He is currently an accredited consultant in the UAE, where he leads reviews of multi-curriculum international schools.

He became an examiner initially for the Poetry Society and, in 1989, for the Guildhall School (later

Trinity-Guildhall, now Trinity College London) and examines widely across the British Isles and overseas in speech, drama and musical theatre. In 2025, he examined in Singapore, Sri Lanka and Mumbai. He also works as a moderator, and examiner-trainer for Trinity College. He has adjudicated at festivals across the UK and Ireland and is a regular visitor to the Hong Kong Schools Festival. George is delighted to be renewing acquaintance with the Stratford and East London Festival in 2027!

Competitors are required to perform from memory a piece of Humorous Verse of their own choice

Prose Speaking

Competitors are required to perform from memory a piece of prose of their own choice. The passage may be taken from any book of fact or fiction but **MUST** be age appropriate.

Verse Speaking

Competitors will select and perform from memory a LYRIC poem of their own choice. A lyric poem is defined as the thoughts and feelings (moods and meditations) of a single voice, not necessarily that of the poet. Poems chosen should be age-appropriate.

Sight Reading

Competitors are required to read an age-appropriate book of their choice before the Festival.

The adjudicator will select a passage from this book to be read out loud. The title of the book chosen must be indicated on the entry form.

Television News Presentation

Competitors are required to take the role of a television newsreader or a roving reporter, treating the adjudicator as the camera.

The content of the newscast is optional. Note cards may be used.

These two classes will be timetabled consecutively. The competitor gaining the highest mark will be awarded the Walter Tee Award; the winner of the remaining class will receive a class winner's medal.

Communication Skills

Competitors will give a talk on a topic of their own choosing. Cards may be used in these Classes as an aide memoir. However, marks will be deducted for over-use of notes. Simple visual aids may be incorporated.

These classes will be timetabled consecutively. The competitor gaining the highest mark will be awarded The Speech and Drama Cup; the winner of the other class will each receive a class winner's medal.

Musical Theatre

Competitors are required to perform a song and a scene/speech as a sequence. These can come from any source and be presented in any order. However, there must be a smooth transition between the two elements as though performing in the context of musical theatre. An introduction must be included. Marks will be awarded for the choice of material as well as the overall performance. Costume/props may be used, but they will not be reflected in the marking. Remember to provide the adjudicator with copies of both the speech and the song.

Pairs will perform a scene and a song as a sequence that demonstrates the ability of both performers equally. A shared introduction must be included.

These classes will be timetabled consecutively with the pair gaining the highest mark being awarded the Anna Knight Cup; the winners of the remaining class will each receive a class winner's medal.
